

The Nature of God Eternal vs Immortal

ETERNAL Being

IMMORTAL beings

(angels, demons, and human souls)

MORTAL beings

(animals, plants, human bodies, etc)

- The Nature of God Eternal vs Immortal

ETERNAL Being

ETERNAL Being: is not born and cannot die, and thus is not limited by TIME; the eternal nature is unique to Divinity (GOD)



MORTAL beings: are born, die, and cease to exist along the line that is TIME


IMMORTAL beings: are born into TIME, but cannot die; in some form they live beyond the line that is TIME

SOME QUALITIES OF THE DIVINE ETERNAL NATURE:

OMNIPRESENCE – no physical body, so not limited by space; capable of being anywhere at any time, or perhaps all places at all times






- The Nature of God Eternal vs Immortal

SOME QUALITIES OF THE DIVINE ETERNAL NATURE:

OMNIPRESENCE – no physical body, so not limited by space; capable of being anywhere at any time, or perhaps all places at all times

OMNISCIENCE – no phyiscal body, so not limited by time; capable of knowing everything about any event before, after, or along the line of TIME






Genesis 1:1-5

If God created "In the beginning" [v1], then what existed before?

- God is ETERNAL
 - Distinction between ETERNAL and IMMORTAL
 - God's eternal nature (His "eternal power and Godhead") is "understood by the things that are made..." [Romans 1:20]
 - this is the "argument from design": the Creator necessarily exists *before* His creation!
 - cp John's "argument" for the deity of Jesus [John chapter 1]



ONLYGOD!!!

- He was "with God, and...was God" [John 1:1]
- "*All things* were made through Him..." [John 1:3]


If He is from "the beginning" (eternal!) and is the Creator, then He is God!



The Nature of God Genesis 1:1-5 "God is Spirit"

"In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth" [v1]

- "...the worlds were framed by the word of God" [Hebrews 11:3]
 - Both visible and invisible, physical and spiritual, terrestrial and celestial
 - "Heavens and the earth" describes the whole created universe [cp "all things" John 1:3]



Genesis 1:1-5

"In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth" [v1] "The earth was..." [v2]

- "...without form" ("without order", "place of chaos")
- "...and void" ("empty")
- "...darkness was on the face of the deep" ("deep darkness", "a dark abyss")

During the week of creation, God will *resolve* these 3 "issues"...



Genesis 1:1-5

"In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth" [v1]

- "The earth was..." [v2] "And the Spirit of God..." [v2]
- the first time we "meet" God in the Bible is as SPIRIT
 - Consider this same practice by God at other times in Bible history:
 - Exodus 3:1-6: appearing to Moses in the burning bush ("fire")
 - Exodus 13:21-22: guiding Israel out of Egypt (pillar of "cloud [smoke]", "fire")
 - Exodus 19:9, 16: appearing to Israel at Sinai ("thick cloud", "thunderings, lightnings")



Moses warned Israel regarding the *spiritual* nature of God

"Take careful heed to yourselves, for *you saw* <u>no form</u> when the Lord spoke to you at Horeb out of the midst of the fire, lest you act corruptly and make for yourselves a carved image in the form of any figure: the likeness of male or female, the likeness of any animal that is on the earth or the likeness of any winged bird that flies in the air, the likeness of anything that creeps on the ground or the likeness of any fish that is in the water beneath the earth. And take heed, lest you lift your eyes to heaven, and when you see the sun, the moon and the stars, all the host of heaven, you feel driven to worship them and serve

them, which the Lord your God has given to all the peoples under the whole heaven as a heritage. But *the Lord* has taken you and brought you out of the iron furnace, out of Egypt, to be His people..."

[Deuteronomy 4:15-20]

Genesis 1:1-5

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 - Exodus 19:9, 16: appearing to Israel at Sinai ("thick cloud", "thunderings, lightnings")
 - Moses' warning to Israel concerning the *spirit* nature of God [Dt 4:15ff]
 - John 4:23-24: Jesus, correcting the religious error of the Samaritan woman explained to her the *spiritual* nature of God

The error of religion is to have changed "the glory of the *incorruptible (Eternal, Spirit) God* into an image made like *corruptible (physical, temporal)* man — and birds and four-footed animals and creeping things. ...and worshiped and served the *creature* rather than the *Creator...*" [Rom 1:23-25]

We must learn <u>from God</u> what <u>true</u> <u>worship</u> is!

- the first time we "meet" God in the Bible is as SPIRIT
 - Consider this same practice by God at other times in Bible history
 - cp 1 Corinthians 2:9-14; we can only know the Spirit's will if HE reveals it!
 - this truth is spoken of in Deuteronomy 29:29 and Romans 10:17
 - thus it is *impossible* to please Him apart from hearing and responding to HIS word;

that is, acting "by faith" [cp Hebrews 11:6]





- God's creative power resides in His word [cp Hebrews 1:1-3]
 - cp what Paul told the Ephesian elders the word has the power to do [Acts 20:32]



- The Nature of God "Then God said..."

Consider the *real power* residing in God's word

"By the word of the Lord the heavens were made, And all the host of them by the breath of His mouth... He spoke, and it was done; He commanded, and it stood fast." [Psalm 33:6, 9]

"...upholding all things by the word of His power"

[Hebrews 1:3 (of Jesus)]

"...the worlds were framed by the word of God"

[Hebrews 11:3]

"For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes..."

[Romans 1:16]

"Sanctify them by Your truth; Your word is truth."

[John 17:17]

If we really believe this, we will not add to or remove from His word!!


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- God's creative power resides in His word [cp Hebrews 1:1-3]
- With the creation of light, God resolves one of the "issues" from verse 2
 - we will see in Genesis 1-4 that it is <u>always</u> God who resolves problems that arise



Genesis 1:1-5

"Then God *said*..." [v3]

"God saw...it was *good*" [v4]

• God declares His creation "good" **7 times** [Genesis 1:4, 9, 12, 18, 21, 25, 31]

• His final analysis: "indeed it was *very good*" [Genesis 1:31]

- God's nature is such that He can *only do* what is GOOD!

- "Far be it from God to do wickedness" [Job 34:10; cp Gn 18:25]
- with God there is "...no shadow of turning" [James 1:17]
- we must allow *God* to define what is "good"!
 - if something God does seems *not* good, it is *my view* that must change

 - cp the work of the priests [Lv 10:10; "distinguish" is "divide" here; cp also Lv 11:44-47]

- God "divides" **7 times** during creation [Gn 1:4, 6, 9, 11, 14, 21(24); 2:3]
 - It is God's nature to make things holy, to "sanctify" [cp John 17:17-19;
 - Ephesians 1:3-4; 1 Peter 1:15-16 (quoting Leviticus 19:2); etc]

- God "names" things, determines roles and purposes [cp Eph 3:14-15; Php 2:8-11]
 - God "names" 7 things in creation ["Day"/"Night" (v5), "Heaven" (v8),
 - "Earth"/"Seas" (v10), "male"/"female" (v27)]

• The language used here is not mythic, but as *historical* fact

- cp "Creation myths" (epic poems) of other religions; Hindu, Native American, Chinese, etc are often taught in mythical/epic formats

- no reason from context to see the language as symbolic; in fact, it is written with an emphasis that indicates it is meant literally

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• The language used here is not mythic, but as *historical* fact

 The eternal God (*outside* of time) created Day and Night, evening and morning; *time* begins here for all creation



Consider what we have learned of God's nature from just one day of creation

- ✓ God is ETERNAL (a uniquely Divine trait) [1:1]
- ✓ God is SPIRIT (He is not physical, He is not like man) [1:2]
- ✓ God's creative power resides in HIS WORD [1:3]
- \checkmark God is GOOD (it is impossible for Him to think or to act by evil) [1:4]
- ✓ God is HOLY (He is separate from creation; His nature is to sanctify) [1:4]

- God *speaks*, God "*divides*", and God *names* again
 - "...God called the firmament **Heaven**" [v8]

The "Heavens"

The Bible speaks of three "heavens":

"Heaven" [Gn 1:6]



- the blue sky, covered by clouds and filled with an atmosphere to sustain the breath of terrestrial beings
- the dwelling-place of birds: cp Genesis 1:6-8, 20; see also Psalm 8:8; etc

- the rest of the physical universe that lies beyond earth's atmosphere; outer space
- the 'home' of the planets and the stars: cp Genesis 1:14-16; Psalm 19:1; etc



The "third heaven" or "heaven of heavens":

All of the heavens were made by God: Deuteronomy 10:14





The Nature of God "A God of Order"

<u>Genesis 1:6-13</u>

"Let there be a firmament..." [v6]

- God speaks, God "divides", and God names again
 - "...God called the firmament **Heaven**" [v8]
 - this firmament would "divide the waters from the waters" [v6]
 - a division of waters "**under** the firmament" from waters "**above** the firmament" [v7]
 - this is the creation of the water cycle, an atmosphere; a covering layer of clouds separated from an enormous ocean by means of *the sky* [cp 2 Peter 3:5-7]



"waters...above the firmament"

■ "Heaven" = *sky*, *atmosphere*

"waters...under the firmament"




- "And God called the dry land Earth" [v10] "and...the waters He called Seas" [v10]

• the language here does not exclude the possibility of an original supercontinent ("Pangaea"; et al)



The Nature of God

When God divides light ("Day") from darkness ("Night") [1:4-5], and the waters below from the waters above the firmament [1:6-7], and the Seas from the dry land of Earth [1:9-10], He shows He is a God of order; His powerful word ordains things, placing *form* where before there was only chaos...



A God of Order

The commandments of the Creator give order to (*ordain*, *organize*) the creation

"And the LORD God commanded (Hb 'tsavah'; order, divinely ordain) the man, saying, 'Of every tree of the garden you may freely eat; but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat..."

Genesis 2:16-17

"You shall observe My judgments and keep My ordinances, to walk in them: I am the LORD your God."

Leviticus 18:4

"Now concerning the collection for the saints, as I have given orders to the churches of Galatia, so you must do also..."





"...let them be for signs"

Sometimes the Lord *literally* uses heavenly bodies as indicators

"The *heavens* declare the glory of God; And the *firmament* shows His handiwork. ...In them He has set a tabernacle for *the sun...*" Psalm 19:1, 4 (*heavens* = God exists)

"Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea... wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, saying, 'Where is He who has been born King of the Jews? For we have seen *His star* in the East and have come to worship Him." Matthew 2:1-2

(an actual heavenly body indicated where the Christ was born)

"Now from the sixth hour until the ninth hour there was darkness over all the land." Matthew 27:45 (some special heavenly event [not an eclipse!] indicated God's wrath over sin)

cp also Joshua's "long day" [Joshua 10:11-14]; Hezekiah's request that the sun go backward "ten degrees" [2 Kg 20:1-11; Isaiah 38:7-8] (God's power over creation is clearly indicated)

• "...let them be for lights" [v15, 17]

God made these things (and all things!) thinking of man (me and you!) before there was ever any man on the earth!









The Nature of God 4-19 "A God of Order"


Genesis 1:14-19

"Let there be lights in the firmament of the heavens..." [v14]

- "...to *divide* the day from the night" [v14] "...let them be for *signs*" [v14]
- "God made two great lights: the greater light *to rule* the day,

and the lesser light *to rule* the night" [v16, 18]

- "He made the stars also" [v16]



The two "great lights" 'rule' in two ways:

- 1. they "give light on the earth", making life and work possible [cp John 9:4];
- 2. they "*divide* the light from...darkness" to establish the presence of the kingdom (*rule*) of God [cp Col 1:13; 1 Pet 2:9; etc]

"...let them be for signs"

Sometimes the Lord *literally* uses heavenly bodies as indicators

At other times the Lord uses heavenly bodies *figuratively*

"How you have fallen from heaven, O *star of the morning* (latin, 'lucifer'), son of the dawn! You have been cut down to the earth, You who have weakened the nations." Isaiah 14:12 (king of Babylon [v4] pictured figuratively as a star falling)

"...I will show wonders in the heavens and in the earth. The sun shall be turned into darkness, And the moon into blood, Before the coming of the great and awesome day of the LORD." Joel 2:30-31 (a <u>figure</u> of judgment; the heavenly 'rulers'

humbled by the presence of God; cp Joel 2:10; 3:15; Isaiah 13:10)

"The city had no need of the sun or of the moon to shine in it, for the glory of God illuminated it. The Lamb is its light." Rev 21:23 ("New Jerusalem" figuratively governed by the light of God; cp the use of "outer darkness" in Matt 8:12; 22:13; 25:30)

The Nature of God 20-25 "A God of Order"

Genesis 1:20-25

"Let the waters **abound** with an **abundance** of living creatures" [v20]

- God decrees a *filling* of the earth, an *abundance* of creatures [vv21-22]
- "...God blessed them, saying, 'Be fruitful and multiply..." [v22]

After creating *light* to dissipate the *darkness* [v3, vv15-18], and after organizing (*ordering*) His creation [vv6-10], God then *fills* the emptiness (*void*) on *the earth* [vv11-12; plants], in *the heavens* [vv14-18; sun, moon, and stars], in *the sea* [vv20-22], in *the sky* [vv20-22; birds], and also over the face of *all the earth* [vv24-25; creeping things, beasts, cattle]. He has *resolved* the three pending issues present in Genesis 1:2!

God's law for production and reproduction of seed "according to its kind" is so efficient it is **repeated 7 times** here during the creation of the distinct ("separate") animal species! [vv21, 24-25]

"...according to its kind"

The Bible's creation account does not allow for the general theory of evolution

- This feels like a difficult declaration these days because "science" is so sure of itself!
 - if we speak up about these things, we are ridiculed as "science deniers" or worse!
 - there are a few things we would do well to remember about science:
 - real science depends on the process of *observation*
 - science has not created the world, but merely *observes* it; God claims to speak from His position as Creator. Man is *limited*!
 - the observer's 'position', his 'vision' (Darwin had no microscope), his biases and preconceived ideas might falsify his conclusions

The scientific method

a method of procedure that has characterized natural science since the 17th century, consisting in *systematic observation*, measurement, and experiment, and the formulation, testing, and modification of hypotheses. *[Dictionary.com]*






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 - 2 science has *often* been wrong
 - give it 200 years; much of what we believe will be seen as error!









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 - there are a few things we would do well to remember about science:
 - real science depends on the process of *observation*
 - 2 science has *often* been wrong
 - 3 we need not fear real science, but embrace it
 - the more we *observe* what God has made, the more we should come to know and love Him and the beauty of His intelligence
 - Isaac Newton, Johannes Kepler, Albert Einstein, and others saw observational science as a way to draw near to the Creator
 - science and the Bible are not an either/or proposition!



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 - there are a few things we would do well to remember about science:
 - since science cannot prove or disprove the existence of God, any "science" that on principle rejects the possibility of God is foolishness [cp Rom 1:19-23]
- The Bible register offers the most plausible explanations for those things that science
 - observes; and, while science cannot prove or disprove God, the facts of revelation [miracles, fulfilled prophecies, etc] can!
 - God does not expect us to believe based on "science" but on "faith" cp Hebrews 11:6; Romans 10:17



Consider what we learn of God's nature from His account of the creation

- ✓ God is ETERNAL (a uniquely Divine trait) [1:1]
- ✓ God is SPIRIT (He is not physical, He is not like man) [1:2]
- ✓ God's creative power resides in HIS WORD [1:3]
- \checkmark God is GOOD (it is impossible for Him to think or to act by evil) [1:4]
- ✓ God is HOLY (He is separate from creation; His nature is to sanctify) [1:4]
- ✓ God is a GOD OF ORDER (disobedience to his word brings disorder) [1:6-9]
- ✓ God is a GOD WHO PLANS (He made the physical creation for man before

man ever existed) [1:14; cp Eph 1:4; etc]

✓ God is LORD (He governs His creation by fixed laws)
[1:11, 21, 24; only God has the power to break the
fixed laws - the definition of miracle (cp John 3:2)]
